⇒ In the case of absence due to illness, no medical certificate/attestation is required for return to school (the obligation to justify any absence remains).

The school (through the Medical Service) reserves the right to request a medical certificate/attestation declaring illness after absence due to illness of more than:

- 3 days for the nursery cycle.
- 5 days for the primary and secondary cycles.
- ⇒ Without prejudice to the obligation to report any absence as indicated above, for privacy reasons any medical documentation should be sent exclusively to the Medical Service (VAR-MEDCENTRE@eursc.eu).

• RECOMMENDATIONS RELATED TO THE PREVENTION OF SARS-COV-2 TRANSMISSION

- ⇒ In the event of mild respiratory symptoms of an unspecified nature (rhinitis, coughing, etc.), students may attend school, but wearing a mask is recommended.
- ⇒ Pupils who test positive in a diagnostic or antigenic test for Covid are no longer subject to isolation measures. However, it is recommended to observe the same precautions as for preventing the transmission of respiratory infections:
 - If one is <u>symptomatic</u>, stay at home until the symptoms have ended.
 - Even in the case of students with an <u>asymptomatic</u> positive covid swab, it is recommended to wear a mask to frequent the school community.
 - The Medical Service will assess whether students with moderate/severe symptoms should return home.
- ⇒ Possible changes may be made in the event of new indications from the Ministry of Health, attached is the latest available circular which we strongly encourage you to read: Aggiornamento delle misure di prevenzione della trasmissione di SARS-CoV-2.
